News from Niger

Oh my Goodness!! Your tests were amazing!! Did I say AMAZING?????!!!

Alynné, we were so blessed by the power that this quick diagnostic had in the clinic while in Niger. We were able to quickly diagnose and treat malaria without taking the doctor's time. Once the [diagnosis] was given we had the NP write the [prescription] and they were given the drugs and released to go to see the pastors. We went with 3,000 worm treatments and those were all given away on day 5 of 7 days. We ordered 200 malaria treatments and we gave away 150 treatments. We did use some of the H. Pylori which were also positive results. Probably a dozen of each of the STD tests were done and were also positive.

Because of these tests we were able to screen and treat and see more people because the tests were able to give us such quick results.

I am attaching a copy of the travel journal for you to see. God did some amazing things in the Nigeriens and in US!!

Haiti

Many of you have asked if/how Science with a Mission is connected to Haiti. Even

though our diagnostics have been used in many different countries – **there is no country with more organizations and individuals using our tests than Haiti.** A quick count showed 21 different groups having placed an order for use in Haiti in the past two and a half years.

Two days before the earthquake struck, I received an order for almost 3,000 diagnostics from a doctor who works with Haiti Foundation of Hope (www.haitifoundationofhope.org). This morning, I received this word: "Hello Alynné:

My timing to place a lab order has not been ideal. I am presently in Haiti on a trauma team, in the midst of [Port-Au-Prince]. I had to leave in 48 hours, and it looks like we will be here for 2 months. This is not the time to do the kind of studies that I would have liked to do. Therefore, I am going to have to cancel my lab order. I hope to pick this up later, but based on what I am seeing now, it doesn't look like this will happen anytime soon. Thanks, Joe"

Then there is Lori with Real Hope for Haiti. They run a Rescue Center for severely malnourished children. This was the brief message she sent on Friday: "Sleeping out due to structural damage. Have several injured, but now under control. Went into [Port-Au-Prince] and work with other missionaries in their driveway. This is like a war zone. Crazy. People walking around with no arms, hands, etc. We are working with US military and trying to help as many as we can.
